



- System for Award Management (SAM)
- https://sam.gov/content/home
- 100% Free to Register
- DO NOT go through a third party that may charge for registration.
- An Active SAM.gov registration is needed to finalize a grant agreement with the USDA Forest Service.
- When applying for funding, provide a screenshot that you have begun the <u>SAM.gov</u> registration process.
- Entity name in SAM must match business/organization name in application





FY2025 Overview

- Up to \$8M is available for this announcement
- Applicants may apply for up to \$300,000
- Exception: \$1,000,000 is available for a stationary wood energy system greater than 5MW in thermal output
- The purchase of stationary sawmill and other wood processing equipment is allowed





- Substantially expand and accelerate wood products markets and wood energy markets throughout the United States to support forest management needs on National Forest System and other forest lands.
- RFP supports the Agriculture Improvement Act of 2018 (Pub. L. 115-334), Rural Revitalization Technologies (7 U.S.C. 6601), and the nationwide challenge of disposing of hazardous fuels and other wood residues from National Forest and other forest lands in a manner that supports wood products and wood energy markets.



Goals of the Wood Innovations Funding Opportunity:

- Reduce hazardous fuels and improve forest health on National Forest System and other forest lands
- Reduce costs of forest management on all land types
- Promote economic and environmental health of communities

Intent of the Wood Innovations Funding Opportunity is to stimulate, expand, and support wood products markets and wood energy markets.



Preference will be given to proposals that:

- Create or expand markets for wood and biomass generated by forest health and hazardous fuels reduction projects on <u>National Forest System</u> and other U.S. forested lands.
- Support development of domestically sourced timber and U.S. manufacturing of mass timber and other wood products.
- Support commercial building markets or other markets that use innovative wood products.
- Clearly demonstrate how the project will reduce land management costs.
- Commit to utilizing <u>domestically sourced timber</u> for mass timber construction projects.
- Involve wood products or wood industry partners.
- Support, benefit, or engage communities that are historically underserved, marginalized, and adversely affected by persistent poverty or inequality (pursuant to <u>Executive Order 13985</u>, Advancing Racial Equity and Support for Underserved Communities Through the Federal Government).



Other items to note:

- Projects must provide a preference for the purchase, acquisition, or use of goods, products, or materials produced in the United States pursuant to <u>2 CFR § 200.322</u>.
- Labor for operation or production expenses will not be funded with federal funds
- Non-stationary, i.e., portable or mobile equipment, will not be funded in this program.
- Basic research, construction, equipment purchases except stationary wood energy or sawmill equipment will NOT be considered.
 - 2 CFR 200.310, 2 CR 200.313, 2 CFR 200.316
- Expenses for self-marketing and self-promotion are not eligible expenses.
- Proposals should align with Forest Service Regional priorities and State Forest Action Plans.




Examples of projects:

- Engineering designs, cost analyses, and/or permitting necessary, in the later stages of commercial construction projects or in the later stages of wood energy project.
- Showcase quantifiable environmental and economic benefits of using wood as a sustainable building material.
- Establishing or increasing wood products manufacturing capacity and/or markets that support forest ecosystem restoration.
- Developing commercial woody biomass and wood product utilization industrial parks or develop a cluster of wood energy projects
- Purchase stationary wood energy equipment, <u>sawmill equipment</u>, <u>or other</u> <u>wood products equipment</u> to create markets to support forest management.
- Creating of Statewide Wood Utilization/Wood Energy Teams




Statewide Wood Energy Teams and Statewide Wood Utilization Teams 2024 Status



2024 Results

- 214 proposals received
- 117 proposals funded
- \$31.3 million Forest Service funds, \$68 million match
 - 100 wood products markets (36 related to mass timber)
 - 17 wood energy





Overall Requirements

- Available Funding: Up to \$8 million. Most awards (excluding match) will not exceed \$300,000
- Exception: \$1,000,000 is available for a stationary wood energy system greater then 5MW in thermal output.
- Eligible applicants: For-profits; State, local, and Tribal governments; school districts; communities; not-for-profit organizations; institutions of higher education; and special purpose districts (e.g., public utilities districts, fire districts, conservation districts, and ports)



Overall Requirements

- Matching: (1:1 match) Applicants must contribute at least 100% of the Forest Service requested funds. For every \$1 of Federal funding requested, applicants must provide at least \$1 in match. Cash or in-kind match allowed. Federal salary cannot be match. Forest Service funds cannot be used to fund Forest Service involvement in the project.
- Award Type: Grants and Cooperative Agreements awarded under this announcement are typically awarded for 2 to 3 years.



Project Impact


- Project outcomes, deliverables, and desired results
- Magnitude of the impact on market
- Benefits to NFS and other lands with metrics
- Job creation and retention
- Include assumptions used to determine these impacts
- Additional funds and/or contributions above the minimum required match that maximize proposed project benefits





Qualifications of Team and Partners


- List key personnel qualifications and roles in project.
- Describe their capabilities and certifications as well as experience on related projects that demonstrate your team has the appropriate skill set and experience for success.
- Experience on prior funded Forest Service projects
- Performance on prior funded Forest Service projects





Annual Progress Reports and Final Reports

- Describe reports, documents, and success stories that will be provided during and at the end of the project for posting on the Wood Innovations website
- Provide contact information for the person responsible for reporting





Budget Summary and Justification (Very Important!)

2 CFR 200.400 subpart E – Cost Principles

- Address proposed expenditures
- Specify cash and in-kind match, other Federal funds, and staff time that will help accomplish the program of work
- <u>Must</u> submit letters of support from third-party organizations confirming the amount of cash or in-kind services to be provided, up to the minimum required match

Please note that construction costs cannot be used as match



Appendices

- Letters of support from third-party organizations confirming the amount of cash or in-kind services to be provided, up to the minimum required match
- List of all other funds (Federal, State, private) received for this project within the last 5 years
- Table of Contents if there are more than two separate appendices
- Documentation or cost quotes for equipment (if applicable)
 - Energy efficiency and details regarding 5mW provision
- Copy of System for Award Management (SAM) registration



Required Financial Forms

- Required forms in Request for Proposals instructions
- SAM: The applicant must have initiated the registration process in the https://sam.gov/content/home to apply. You must include a screenshot of the SAM registration page indicating that you have initiated the registration process in the application appendices, or your application will be denied.
- Additionally, your agency must have attained an active registration prior to the final selection and announcements of grant awards to be eligible for an award.
- There is no charge for registration. Active registration must be maintained throughout the life of the award.
- Entity name in SAM.gov must match organization/business name in other paperwork



Wood Innovations Grant proposals – Common Issues


- Ineligible expenses i.e. construction, operating costs
- Incorrect indirect charges
- Personnel costs aren't described
- Personnel costs contain profit (e.g. billable hours)
- Missing equipment/contracting quotes
- Requested funding/match does not total what is in Part 1: Budget Narrative
- SF-424 entity name does not match SAM entity name

Email finalized application to your Forest Service Regional Coordinator listed in the RFP by 5:00 p.m. local time in the region you submit


- TWO separate searchable PDF files:
 - ✓ Part 1: Cooperator Contact Information, Narrative, and any Appendices
 - ✓ Part 2: Required Financial Forms





Forest Service Regional Coordinators

- Receive all application submittals by e-mail
- Advise interested applicants and answer questions
- Manage grants and participate with cooperative agreements
- Receive communication about media events or activities generated by the award from awardees





USFS Community Navigators

- Provide support and guidance to USFS grants, services, and funding programs
- Partnership with six non-profit organizations to build capacity and information among communities
- Provide technical assistance to help communities identify and apply for funding opportunities and comply with post-award requirements.
