



## **HUD Awards \$95.5 Million for Affordable Housing and Community Development Activities in Native American Communities**

*Funds support development and operation of low-income housing*

May 22, 2023

WASHINGTON - The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) today awarded \$95 million to 55 communities through the Indian Community Development Block Grant (ICDBG) Program. Grant funds may be used for infrastructure, community facilities, housing rehabilitation, economic development, and more to support Native American and Alaskan Native families on Indian reservations and in other Indian areas.

"The Biden-Harris Administration is committed to sharing resources with Tribal communities so they can meet their own unique needs," said HUD Secretary Marcia L. Fudge. "The funding announced today will help make Tribal communities safer, healthier, and help families thrive."

The ICDBG program is a competitive grant that provides a range of eligible activities on reservations and related areas. Eligible activities include housing rehabilitation, land acquisition, roads, water and sewer facilities, and single or multipurpose community buildings.

**HUD Announces \$147 Million to Tribal Communities for Affordable Housing and Community Development**

WASHINGTON – The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) on Thursday announced 83 awards totaling \$147 million for affordable housing and community development projects that primarily benefit people with low and moderate incomes in American Indian and Alaska Native communities.

“Every person deserves a fair shot to get ahead—one that includes access to safe, affordable housing and a vibrant community,” said **Secretary Marcia L. Fudge**. “That is why we are pleased to make over 80 awards to American Indian and Alaska Native communities across the country so that they can build new housing and solve their most pressing housing and economic challenges. These funds are an important investment in Tribal communities that need it most.”

HUD also awarded almost \$52 million to 59 communities through the Indian Community Development Block Grant (ICDBG) Program to develop community facilities, carry out public works projects, and provide economic development assistance. [View the list of awardees here.](#)
