SUBJECT: Fiscal Year 2024 Preparedness Grant Programs Final Allocation

Announcement

Today, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), a component of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), is announcing the final awards and allocations under the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 preparedness grant programs. These programs include:

- Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP)
 - State Homeland Security Program¹
 - o Urban Area Security Initiative¹
 - Operation Stonegarden
- Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program (THSGP)
- Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP)
- Port Security Grant Program (PSGP)
- Transit Security Grant Program (TSGP)
- Intercity Passenger Rail (IPR) Program Amtrak¹
- Intercity Bus Security Grant Program (IBSGP)

Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program¹

The total amount of funds allocated for the FY 2024 Preparedness Grant Programs announced in this Information Bulletin is \$1,979,464,968.¹

FY 2024 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP)

HSGP includes a suite of risk-based grants to assist state, local, tribal and territorial efforts to prevent, prepare for, protect against, and respond to acts of terrorism.. The grants included under HSGP are:

State Homeland Security Program (SHSP)². In FY 2024, SHSP provides \$373.5 million to assist state, local, tribal, and territorial governments in preventing, preparing for, protecting against, and responding to acts of terrorism. SHSP also provides funding to implement initiatives based on capability targets and gaps identified during the Threat and Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA) process and assessed in the Stakeholder Preparedness Review (SPR) (See Table 1).

Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI). In FY 2024, UASI provides \$553.5 million to assist highrisk urban areas in preventing, preparing for, protecting against, and responding to acts of terrorism (See Table 2).

Operation Stonegarden (OPSG). OPSG provides \$81 million to enhance cooperation and coordination among state, local, tribal, territorial, and federal law enforcement agencies in a joint mission to secure the United States' borders along routes of ingress from international borders, to include travel corridors in states bordering Mexico and Canada, as well as states and territories with international water borders (See Table 3).

FY 2024 Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program (THSGP)

In FY 2024, THSGP provides \$13.5 million to directly eligible tribes to support the building, sustainment, and delivery of core capabilities to enable tribes to strengthen their capacity to prevent, prepare for, protect against, and respond to potential terrorist attacks. As in previous fiscal years, the THSGP will be a competitive grant program (See Table 4).

¹ The following FY 2024 grant programs are not part of this announcement and will be awarded separately: Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) Program (\$291.6 million), Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant Program (\$324 million), Fire Prevention and Safety (FP&S) Grant Program (\$32.4 million), and Regional Catastrophic Preparedness Grant Program (\$10.8 million).

² Per section 2006 of the *Homeland Security Act of 2002* (codified as amended at 6 U.S.C. § 607), DHS/FEMA is required to ensure that at least 25% of grant funding appropriated for grants awarded under HSGP's authorizing statute are used for law enforcement terrorism prevention activities (LETPA). By policy, DHS/FEMA increased that requirement to 35% for FY 2024. DHS/FEMA meets this requirement, in part, by requiring all SHSP and UASI recipients to ensure that at least 35% of the combined HSGP funds allocated under SHSP and UASI are dedicated towards LETPAs, as defined in 6 U.S.C. § 607. The LETPA allocation can be from SHSP, UASI, or both. Since the majority of OPSG funds are already used for LETPAs, this is not an additional requirement for OPSG.

FY 2024 Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP)

The NSGP provides \$454.5 million in funding support for facility hardening and other physical security enhancements and activities to nonprofit organizations that are at a high risk of a terrorist or other extremist attack. Of this amount, \$227.25 million in funding is available to nonprofit organizations located within one of the FY 2024 UASI-designated high-risk urban areas (NSGP-Urban Area or NSGP-UA) (See Table 5). In FY 2024, additional, separate funding in the amount of \$227.25 million is also appropriated for nonprofit organizations located outside of the FY 2024 UASI-designated high-urban areas (NSGP-State or NSGP-S) (See Table 6).

FY 2024 Port Security Grant Program (PSGP)

In FY 2024, PSGP provides \$90 million to provide funds to port authorities, facility operators, and state, local, and territorial agencies required to provide security services to implement Area Maritime Security Plans, facility security plans, and other port-wide risk management activities. As in previous fiscal years, the PSGP will be a competitive grant program. (See Table 7).

FY 2024 Transit Security Grant Program (TSGP)

TSGP provides \$83.7 million to support transportation infrastructure security activities. The TSGP provides funds to eligible public transportation systems (which include intra-city bus, commuter bus, ferries, and all forms of passenger rail) that serve historically eligible UASI-designated high-risk urban areas to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism and to increase the resilience of transit infrastructure. As in previous fiscal years, the TSGP will be a competitive grant program (See Table 8).

FY 2024 Intercity Passenger Rail (IPR) Program - Amtrak

IPR provides \$9 million to the National Passenger Railroad Corporation (Amtrak) to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism and to increase the resilience of the Amtrak rail system.

FY 2024 Intercity Bus Security Grant Program (IBSGP)

The IBSGP provides \$1.8 million to owners and operators of intercity bus systems providing service to, from, or through historically eligible UASI-designated high-risk urban areas to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism and to increase the resilience of transit infrastructure. (See Table 9).

FY 2024 Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program

The EMPG provides \$319.5 million to assist state, local, tribal, and territorial governments to prepare for all hazards. In addition to this funding, FEMA must also make available \$50,000 from the Disaster Relief Fund to the Republic of the Marshall Islands pursuant to Article X of the Federal Programs and Services Agreement of the Compact of Free Association Amendments Act of 2003, as amended, Pub. L. No. 108-188 (see Tables 10 and 11).

Final Allocation Announcement

Today, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), a component of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), is announcing the final awards and allocations under the Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 preparedness grant programs. These are:

- Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP)
 - State Homeland Security Program¹
 - Urban Area Security Initiative¹
 - o Operation Stonegarden
- Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program¹
- Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program (THSGP)
- Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP)
- Port Security Grant Program (PSGP)
- Transit Security Grant Program (TSGP)
- Intercity Passenger Rail (IPR) Program Amtrak¹
- Intercity Bus Security Grant Program (IBSGP)

¹ Grant allocations for these programs were announced on April 12, 2019 as part of the Notice of Funding Opportunity release as well as the Grant Programs Directorate Information Bulletin #440.

The total amount of funds allocated for the FY 2019 Preparedness Grant Programs announced in this Information Bulletin is \$1,715,100,000.²

FY 2019 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP)

The HSGP includes a suite of risk-based grants to assist state, local, and tribal efforts in preventing, preparing for, protecting against and responding to acts of terrorism. The grants included under HSGP are:

State Homeland Security Program (SHSP)³. SHSP provides \$415,000,000 to support the implementation of the National Preparedness System and building a culture of preparedness through planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events. SHSP also provides funding to implement initiatives based on capability targets and gaps identified during the Threat and Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA) process and assessed in the Stakeholder Preparedness Review (SPR).

*Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI)*³. The UASI program provides \$590,000,000 to address the unique planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs of high-threat, high-density urban areas, and assists them in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events.

Operation Stonegarden (OPSG). OPSG provides \$90,000,000 to enhance cooperation and coordination among local, tribal, territorial, state, and Federal law enforcement agencies in a joint mission to secure the United States' borders along routes of ingress from international borders to include travel corridors in states bordering Mexico and Canada, as well as states and territories with international water borders.

FY 2019 Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program

The EMPG Program provides \$350,100,000 to assist state, local, and tribal governments for the purpose of providing a system of emergency preparedness for the protection of life and property in the United States from all hazards and to vest responsibility for emergency preparedness jointly in the Federal Government and the states and their political subdivisions. This total funding amount includes \$100,000 from the Disaster Relief Fund that FEMA makes available to the Federated States of Micronesia and the Republic of the Marshall Islands.

Assistance to Firefighters Grants (\$315,000,000), Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response Grants (\$350,000,000), Fire Prevention and Safety Grants (\$35,000,000), and Presidential Residence Protection Assistance Grants (\$41,000,000).

² The following FY 2019 grant programs are not part of this announcement and will be awarded separately:

³ Per section 2006 of the *Homeland Security Act of 2002*, as amended (6 U.S.C. § 607), DHS/FEMA is required to ensure that at least 25 percent (25%) of grant funding appropriated for grants awarded under HSGP's authorizing statute are used for law enforcement terrorism prevention activities. DHS/FEMA meets this requirement, in part, by requiring all SHSP and UASI recipients to ensure that at least 25 percent (25%) of the combined HSGP funds allocated under SHSP and UASI are dedicated towards law enforcement terrorism prevention activities, as defined in 6 U.S.C. § 607. The LETPA allocation can be from SHSP, UASI, or both. This requirement does not include award funds from OPSG.

FY 2019 Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program (THSGP)

The THSGP provides \$10,000,000 to directly eligible tribes to support the building, sustainment, and delivery of core capabilities to enable tribes to strengthen their capacity to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from potential terrorist attacks.

FY 2019 Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP)

In FY 2019, the Nonprofit Security Grant Program provides \$60,000,000 in funding support for target hardening and other physical security enhancements and activities to nonprofit organizations that are at high risk of a terrorist attack. Of this amount, \$50,000,000 in funding was available to nonprofit organizations located within one of the specific UASI-designated high-risk urban areas. In FY 2019, additional, separate funding in the amount of \$10,000,000 has also been appropriated for nonprofit organizations located outside of FY 2019 UASI-designated high-risk urban areas. The intent of the FY 2019 NSGP is to competitively award grant funding to assist nonprofit organizations in obtaining the resources required to support and integrate the preparedness activities of nonprofit organizations that are at high risk of a terrorist attack with broader state and local preparedness efforts. The program seeks to integrate nonprofit preparedness activities with broader state and local preparedness efforts. It is also designed to promote coordination and collaboration in emergency preparedness activities among public and private community representatives, as well as state and local government agencies. The Nonprofit Security Grant Program is a competitive grant program.

FY 2019 Port Security Grant Program (PSGP)

The PSGP provides \$100,000,000 for transportation infrastructure security activities to implement Area Maritime Transportation Security Plans (AMSPs) and facility security plans among port authorities, facility operators, and state and local government agencies required to provide port security services. The purpose of the FY 2019 PSGP is to competitively award grant funding to support increased port-wide risk management; enhance domain awareness; conduct training and exercises; expand port recovery and resiliency capabilities; further capabilities to prevent, detect, respond to, and recover from attacks involving improvised explosive devices and other non-conventional weapons.

FY 2019 Transit Security Grant Program (TSGP)

The TSGP provides \$88,000,000 to support transportation infrastructure security activities. The TSGP provides funds to eligible publicly owned operators of public transportation (which includes intra-city bus, commuter bus, ferries, and all forms of passenger rail) to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism, and to increase the resilience of transit infrastructure.

FY 2019 Intercity Passenger Rail (IPR) Program – Amtrak

In FY 2019, the IPR Program provides \$10,000,000 to the National Passenger Railroad Corporation (Amtrak) to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism, and to increase the resilience of the Amtrak rail system.

FY 2019 Intercity Bus Security Grant Program (IBSGP)

The IBSGP provides \$2,000,000 to owners and operators of intercity bus systems located within the UASI-eligible Urban Areas, to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism, and to increase the resilience of transit infrastructure.

Grant Programs Allocation Announcement

Today, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), a component of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), is pleased to announce final Fiscal Year (FY) 2018 funding allocations for the following grant programs:

- Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP)
 - o State Homeland Security Program¹
 - o Urban Area Security Initiative¹
 - o Operation Stonegarden
- Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program¹
- Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program (THSGP)
- Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP)
- Transit Security Grant Program (TSGP)
- Port Security Grant Program (PSGP)
- Intercity Passenger Rail (IPR) Program Amtrak¹
- Intercity Bus Security Grant Program (IBSGP)

¹ Grant allocations for these programs were announced on May 21, 2018 as part of the Notice of Funding Opportunity release as well as the Grant Programs Directorate Information Bulletin No. 428.

The total amount of funds allocated for the FY 2018 Preparedness Grant Programs announced in this Information Bulletin is \$1,687,100,000.²

FY 2018 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP)

The HSGP includes a suite of risk-based grants to assist state, local, and tribal efforts in preventing, preparing for, protecting against and responding to acts of terrorism. The grants included under HSGP:

State Homeland Security Program (SHSP)³. SHSP provides \$402,000,000 to support the implementation of the National Preparedness System and building a culture of preparedness through planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events. SHSP also provides funding to implement initiatives based on capability targets and gaps identified during the Threat and Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA) process, and assessed in the Stakeholder Preparedness Report (SPR).

Urban Area Security Initiative (*UASI*)³. The UASI program provides \$580,000,000 to address the unique planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs of high-threat, high- density urban areas, and assists them in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events.

Operation Stonegarden (OPSG). OPSG provides \$85,000,000 to enhance cooperation and coordination among local, tribal, territorial, state, and Federal law enforcement agencies in a joint mission to secure the United States' borders along routes of ingress from international borders to include travel corridors in states bordering Mexico and Canada, as well as states and territories with international water borders.

FY 2018 Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program

The EMPG Program provides \$350,100,000 to assist state, local, and tribal governments for the purpose of providing a system of emergency preparedness for the protection of life and property in the United States from all hazards and to vest responsibility for emergency preparedness jointly in the Federal Government and the states and their political subdivisions. This total funding amount includes \$100,000 from the Disaster Relief Fund that FEMA makes available to the Federated States of Micronesia and the Republic of the Marshall Islands.

² The following FY 2018 grant programs are not part of this announcement and will be awarded separately: Assistance to Firefighters Grants (\$315,000,000), Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response Grants (\$350,000,000), Fire Prevention and Safety Grants (\$35,000,000), and Presidential Residence Protection Assistance Grants (\$41,000,000).

³ Per section 2006 of the *Homeland Security Act of 2002*, as amended (6 U.S.C. § 607), DHS/FEMA is required to ensure that at least 25 percent (25%) of grant funding appropriated for grants awarded under HSGP's authorizing statute are used for law enforcement terrorism prevention activities. DHS/FEMA meets this requirement, in part, by requiring all SHSP and UASI recipients to ensure that at least 25 percent (25%) of the combined HSGP funds allocated under SHSP and UASI are dedicated towards law enforcement terrorism prevention activities, as defined in 6 U.S.C. § 607. The LETPA allocation can be from SHSP, UASI, or both. This requirement does not include award funds from OPSG.

FY 2018 Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program (THSGP)

The THSGP provides \$10,000,000 to directly eligible tribes to support the building, sustainment, and delivery of core capabilities to enable tribes to strengthen their capacity to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from potential terrorist attacks.

FY 2018 Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP)

In FY 2018, the Nonprofit Security Grant Program provides \$60,000,000 in funding support for target hardening and other physical security enhancements and activities to nonprofit organizations that are at high risk of a terrorist attack. Of this amount, \$50,000,000 in funding was available to nonprofit organizations located within one of the specific UASI-designated high-risk urban areas. In FY 2018, additional, separate funding in the amount of \$10,000,000 has also been appropriated for nonprofit organizations located outside of FY 2018 UASIdesignated high-risk urban areas. The intent of the FY 2018 NSGP is to competitively award grant funding to assist nonprofit organizations in obtaining the resources required to support and integrate the preparedness activities of nonprofit organizations that are at high risk of a terrorist attack with broader state and local preparedness efforts. The program seeks to integrate nonprofit preparedness activities with broader state and local preparedness efforts. It is also designed to promote coordination and collaboration in emergency preparedness activities among public and private community representatives, as well as state and local government agencies. Under the Nonprofit Security Grant Program - State (NSGP-S), eligible states will receive an allocation for nonprofit organizations located outside of FY 2018 UASI designated Urban Areas. As in previous fiscal years, the Nonprofit Security Grant Program - Urban Area (NSGP-UA) is a competitive grant program.

FY 2018 Transit Security Grant Program (TSGP)

The TSGP provides \$88,000,000 to support transportation infrastructure security activities. The TSGP provides funds to eligible publicly owned operators of public transportation (which includes intra-city bus, commuter bus, ferries, and all forms of passenger rail) to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism, and to increase the resilience of transit infrastructure.

FY 2018 Port Security Grant Program (PSGP)

The PSGP provides \$100,000,000 for transportation infrastructure security activities to implement Area Maritime Transportation Security Plans (AMSPs) and facility security plans among port authorities, facility operators, and state and local government agencies required to provide port security services. The purpose of the FY 2018 PSGP is to competitively award grant funding to support increased port-wide risk management; enhance domain awareness; conduct training and exercises; expand port recovery and resiliency capabilities; further capabilities to prevent, detect, respond to, and recover from attacks involving improvised explosive devices and other non-conventional weapons.

FY 2018 Intercity Passenger Rail (IPR) Program – Amtrak

In FY 2018, the IPR Program provides \$10,000,000 to the National Passenger Railroad Corporation (Amtrak) to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the

traveling public from acts of terrorism, and to increase the resilience of the Amtrak rail system.

FY 2018 Intercity Bus Security Grant Program (IBSGP)

The IBSGP provides \$2,000,000 to owners and operators of intercity bus systems located within the UASI-eligible Urban Areas, to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism, and to increase the resilience of transit infrastructure.

Programs Allocation Announcement

Today, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), a component of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), is pleased to announce final Fiscal Year (FY) 2017 funding allocations for the following grant programs:

- Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP)
 - State Homeland Security Program¹
 - Urban Area Security Initiative¹
 - o Operation Stonegarden
- Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program¹
- Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program (THSGP)
- Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP)
- Transit Security Grant Program (TSGP)
- Port Security Grant Program (PSGP)
- Intercity Passenger Rail (IPR) Program Amtrak¹
- Intercity Bus Security Grant Program (IBSGP)

¹ Grant allocations for these programs were announced on June 2, 2017 as part of the Notice of Funding Opportunity release as well as the Grant Programs Directorate Information Bulletin No. 415.

The total amount of funds allocated for the FY 2017 Preparedness Grant Programs announced in this Information Bulletin is \$1,622,100,000.²

FY 2017 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP)

The HSGP includes a suite of risk-based grants to assist state, local, and tribal efforts in preventing, preparing for, protecting against and responding to acts of terrorism. The grants included under HSGP:

State Homeland Security Program (SHSP)³. SHSP provides \$402,000,000 to support the implementation of the National Preparedness System to address planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events. SHSP also provides funding to implement initiatives based on capability targets and gaps identified during the Threat and Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA) process, and assessed in the State Preparedness Report (SPR).

*Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI)*³. The UASI program provides \$580,000,000 to address the unique planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs of high-threat, high-density urban areas, and assists them in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events.

Operation Stonegarden (OPSG). OPSG provides \$55,000,000 to enhance cooperation and coordination among local, tribal, territorial, state, and Federal law enforcement agencies in a joint mission to secure the United States' borders along routes of ingress from international borders to include travel corridors in states bordering Mexico and Canada, as well as states and territories with international water borders.

FY 2017 Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program

The EMPG Program provides \$350,100,000 to assist state, local, and tribal governments for the purpose of providing a system of emergency preparedness for the protection of life and property in the United States from all hazards and to vest responsibility for emergency preparedness jointly in the Federal Government and the states and their political subdivisions. This total funding amount includes \$100,000 from the Disaster Relief Fund that FEMA makes available to the Federated States of Micronesia and the Republic of the Marshall Islands.

² The following FY 2017 grant programs are not part of this announcement and will be awarded separately: Assistance to Firefighters Grants (\$310,500,000), Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response Grants (\$345,000,000), and Fire Prevention and Safety Grants (\$34,500,000).

³ Per section 2006 of the *Homeland Security Act of 2002*, as amended (6 U.S.C. § 607), DHS/FEMA is required to ensure that at least 25 percent (25%) of grant funding appropriated for grants awarded under HSGP's authorizing statute are used for law enforcement terrorism prevention activities. DHS/FEMA meets this requirement, in part, by requiring all SHSP and UASI recipients to ensure that at least 25 percent (25%) of the combined HSGP funds allocated under SHSP and UASI are dedicated towards law enforcement terrorism prevention activities, as defined in 6 U.S.C. § 607. The LETPA allocation can be from SHSP, UASI, or both. This requirement does not include award funds from OPSG.

FY 2017 Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program (THSGP)

The THSGP provides \$10,000,000 to directly eligible tribes to support the building, sustainment, and delivery of core capabilities to enable tribes to strengthen their capacity to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from potential terrorist attacks.

FY 2017 Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP)

The NSGP provides \$25,000,000 in funding support for hardening and other physical security enhancements to nonprofit organizations that are at high risk of terrorist attack and located within the UASI-eligible Urban Areas. The program seeks to integrate the preparedness activities of nonprofit organizations that are at high risk of terrorist attack with broader state and local preparedness efforts. The NSGP also serves to promote coordination and collaboration in emergency preparedness activities among public and private community representatives, as well as state and local government agencies.

FY 2017 Transit Security Grant Program (TSGP)

The TSGP provides \$88,000,000 to support transportation infrastructure security activities. The TSGP provides funds to eligible publicly owned operators of public transportation (which includes intra-city bus, commuter bus, ferries, and all forms of passenger rail) to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism, and to increase the resilience of transit infrastructure.

FY 2017 Port Security Grant Program (PSGP)

The PSGP provides \$100,000,000 for transportation infrastructure security activities to implement Area Maritime Transportation Security Plans (AMSPs) and facility security plans among port authorities, facility operators, and state and local government agencies required to provide port security services. The purpose of the FY 2017 PSGP is to competitively award grant funding to support increased port-wide risk management; enhance domain awareness; conduct training and exercises; expand port recovery and resiliency capabilities; further capabilities to prevent, detect, respond to, and recover from attacks involving improvised explosive devices and other non-conventional weapons.

FY 2017 Intercity Passenger Rail (IPR) Program – Amtrak

In FY 2017, the IPR Program provides \$10,000,000 to the National Passenger Railroad Corporation (Amtrak) to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism, and to increase the resilience of the Amtrak rail system.

FY 2017 Intercity Bus Security Grant Program (IBSGP)

The IBSGP provides \$2,000,000 to owners and operators of intercity bus systems located within the UASI-eligible Urban Areas, to protect critical surface transportation infrastructure and the traveling public from acts of terrorism, and to increase the resilience of transit infrastructure.
